15th December to 15th January, sugar farms close down after a very lengthy milling season. Our members take their annual break over this period as do many other rural businesses connected with farming.

To choose this period in which to require us to submit our response will not constitute a fair consultative procedure. This will invalidate any EIA process.

We have previously dealt with Eskom with regard to its plans for distribution lines. We time and venue. It is passing strange that on the occasion referred to above Eskom also chose to launch its EIA proceedings in the last week of November, presumably knowing full well the difficulties of conducting proper consultations over Christmas and New Year.

We also note with dismay that Eskom delayed providing the additional information that we had requested until after we had submitted our appeal to the Minister. Then when we sought to use this information to elaborate on the reasons for our objections, we were advised that "counter responding statements by the applicant to the appellants answering statements will only derail the whole process" and that "the Minister will
